Young Media Leaders is an experience-based, capacity-building, and career development platform for aspiring media professionals. The annual programme enables future journalists to gain the passion, mission, and conviction to become powerful and convincing storytellers. Training sessions and practical skills workshops develop industry-focused portfolios that allow their media careers to take off.

The Young Media Leaders programme influences and creates a powerful community of emerging professionals, building a positive and integrated media sector responsive to future challenges, transformations and opportunities.

In 2023, ADMAF partnered with the Sky News Arabia Academy to provide four training courses led by leading industry experts. Two cohorts of 20 Emirati media students and graduates from Abu Dhabi University, Zayed University, American University of Sharjah, Higher College of Technology, and New York University Abu Dhabi attended the courses throughout January and February. The courses centred on content creation, social media coverage, and print and broadcast journalism. The programme featured renowned guest speakers, including Mohamed AlHammadi, Chairman of the Board Of Directors of the UAE Journalists Association; Imane Lahrache, Presenter, Sky News Arabia; Mohammed AlOtaiba, Founder of Syndication Bureau; Dalia Abdalla, Presenter, Sky News Arabia; the late Giselle Khoury, Host, Sky News Arabia; Faisal Bin Huraiz, Trainer of Speakers, Sky News; Saeed Saeed, Journalist, The National; and Dr. Sulaiman Al Hattlan, Founder and CEO of Hattlan Media.

In March, the ambitious students applied the skills they had learned to cover the headline programme of the 20th anniversary Abu Dhabi Festival. Young Media Leaders compiled and published the ADMAF Tribune, contributing reviews and articles, and produced video interviews with the stars of the Festival.

YOUNG FILMMAKERS' CIRCLE



FEBRUARY

A programme designed to provide young filmmakers with a platform to showcase their talents, develop their skills, and connect with industry professionals through workshops, mentorship, and networking opportunities.

AL AIN FILM FESTIVAL

'Millstone', the ADMAF-supported film documenting the life of the late Sheikh Zayed by award-winning Emirati writer and filmmaker Nasser Aldhaheri was also screened at the festival.

THE ARTISTS' STUDIO

This online platform of interviews with the stars of the stage and screen aims to inspire and inform young people about the value of creative thinking and artistic expression. Throughout March, members of ADMAF's Young Media Leaders programme, in collaboration with students from Higher College of Technology, recorded interviews with the line-up of award-winning artists headlining the 20th anniversary edition of Abu Dhabi Festival. Interviews join past episodes on ADMAF's YouTube channel, with interviews recorded over twelve years of festivals.

Open to UAE Nationals aged 18–30, submissions from diverse designers from across the Emirates were judged by an esteemed panel comprising Stefano Galli, Alta Moda Senior VIP relations of Dolce&Gabbana; Asma Al Fahim, Chairwoman of Abu Dhabi Businesswomen Council and founder of Villa 88 magazine; Roberto La Lacona, Director of Marangoni Institute UAE, alongside renowned Emirati artists Azza al Qubaisi, jewellery artist, product designer and sculptor; Ahmad Al Areef Al Dhaheri, multidisciplinary artist; and Sultan al Darmaki, fashion designer; joined by H.E. Huda Alkhamis-Kanoo, ADMAF Founder.

The Fashion category sought contemporary abaya collections inspired by Emirati culture using lacework, flowers, patchwork, embroidery, hand painting. Five selected abayas will form a oneoff special capsule collection by Dolce&Gabbana.

The Jewellery category focussed on blending Emirati influences with Dolce&Gabbana designs, using techniques like micromosaics and precious materials including gold and pearls to create bracelets, earrings and wedding rings.





Launched in 2010, this permanent initiative comprises a research centre, online directory, education hub, advocacy and an information resource that supports Emirati artists, seeking to raise understanding of the national arts sector among gallerists, curators and the wider public.



OPPORTUNITIES

ADMAF creates opportunities for Emirati visual artists. Sharing and facilitating prospects including commissions, exhibiting opportunities, residencies and competitions. Abu Dhabi Festival supported Emirati artist Farah Al Qasimi's residency at the Delfina Foundation in 2017. In late 2023, the Festival supported her solo exhibition, 'Abort, Retry, Fail' at the Delfina Foundation, the artist's first solo exhibition in the UK.

EXHIBITIONS & STUDIO VISITS

ADMAF creates exhibitions and publications to deepen the appreciation and knowledge of Emirati visual arts. In 2023, Emirati artists Moza Almatrooshi and Sarah Almehairi were featured at The MEI Art Gallery's exhibition 'Perceptible Rhythms/Alternative Temporalities' presented with ADMAF at The Middle East Institute, Washington, D.C.

Consisting of acquisitions and donations, the ADMAF Art Collection is an emphasis on Emirati practice and seeks to highlight artistic expression from the Arab world. By exhibiting the collection in its offices and through exhibitions and loans, ADMAF promotes the achievements and oeuvres of each artist – engaging, educating and informing the public about the region's art scene.

A flexible resource consisting of more than 150 works with no permanent gallery, ADMAF welcomes enquiries from institutions interested in loans from the collection. Gifts by individuals and organisations are gratefully received and are assessed based on factors such as condition, provenance, storage and cultural value.









ADMAF is committed to nurturing creativity and innovation both at home and abroad, with grants that support a wide range of artists, scholars, and researchers, helping them to develop their skills, explore new ideas, and create groundbreaking work. With a focus on promoting cultural exchange and fostering cross-cultural understanding, ADMAF Grants play an important role in shaping the future of the arts, both locally and globally.

Additionally, ADMAF Grants facilitate artistic and cultural projects that would otherwise not be possible. Through financial assistance and mentorship, grants support emerging and established Emirati art practitioners, among other individuals and organisations, wishing to further their artistic practice and add value to UAE society.

In 2023, ADMAF provided five grants to: Art for Autism; a book grant for Dr Noura Al Mazrouei; a grant to Mariam Al Askari, for education and research; a grant for the Abu Dhabi University Student Exchange; and, together with American University of Sharjah, a grant for a Film Hackathon.





ABU DHABI FESTIVAL NIELSEN STUDY

ADMAF commissioned the international firm Nielsen to conduct an assessment of the social and economic impact of Abu Dhabi Festival 2023 on the local economy.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

Abu Dhabi Festival 2023 delivered significant economic and social value to Abu Dhabi. In 2023, the Festival generated a total impact of AED 61.6 million, comprising AED 50 million in direct economic impact and AED 11.5 million in social impact value. Notably, despite decreased funding, the Festival improved efficiency compared to previous editions, generating an impact of AED 3 per dirham invested, up from AED 1.7 per dirham in 2018.

INFLUENCE IN AND FOR ABU DHABI

Asserting Abu Dhabi's place as a global cultural destination, the Festival is important to the city, supporting a robust year-round appreciation and appetite for arts and culture.

Abu Dhabi Festival audiences strongly associated the Festival with its cross-cultural (84%) and international (80%) programming. The Festival is seen as vital to the city, supporting a robust year-round appreciation for arts and culture. It promotes economic growth by generating strong engagement from residents in arts and culture events, contributing to the importance of the Emirate's status as a cultural capital. 98% of attendees felt it was important for Abu Dhabi to have a major music and arts event like Abu Dhabi Festival, with 95% feeling there should be more events across the year. This highlights the Festival's role in generating a year-round appetite for arts and culture.

In 2023, audience members planned to return in future years, with 82% likely to attend again. This was a year of new audiences – for 54% of guests, it was their first time at the Festival. This strong retention rate among first-time visitors is a promising indicator of future growth. It demonstrates the Festival's ability to attract, retain and cultivate audiences passionate about arts and culture.


