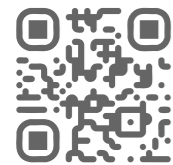

Sir Ian Stoutzker CBE

ADMAF mourns the passing of its advisor and dear friend, Sir Ian Stoutzker CBE - a distinguished banker, musician, and philanthropist, renowned for his advocacy of the arts. In 2017, he co-founded Live Music Now with his good friend and renowned violinist Sir Yehudi Menuhin and played pivotal roles in numerous institutions including ADMAF, Royal College of Music, Philharmonia Orchestra, London Symphony Orchestra and European Union Youth Orchestra. For his lifelong commitment to art, music and culture, Sir Ian was appointed Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) in 2012, received the Prince of Wales Medal for Arts Philanthropy in 2013, and was knighted in the Queen's Birthday Honours in 2019. He was also honoured with the prestigious Abu Dhabi Festival Award in 2023. May his legacy live on through the countless lives he touched and the lasting impact he made on the arts and music communities worldwide.

We also aligned our efforts with those of the UAE government in collaboration with the Emirates Red Crescent through the 'Tarahum for Gaza' campaign. A portion of the proceeds from Abu Dhabi Festival tickets were dedicated to this campaign, affirming our unwavering commitment to the UAE's humanitarian efforts in support of the Palestinian people.

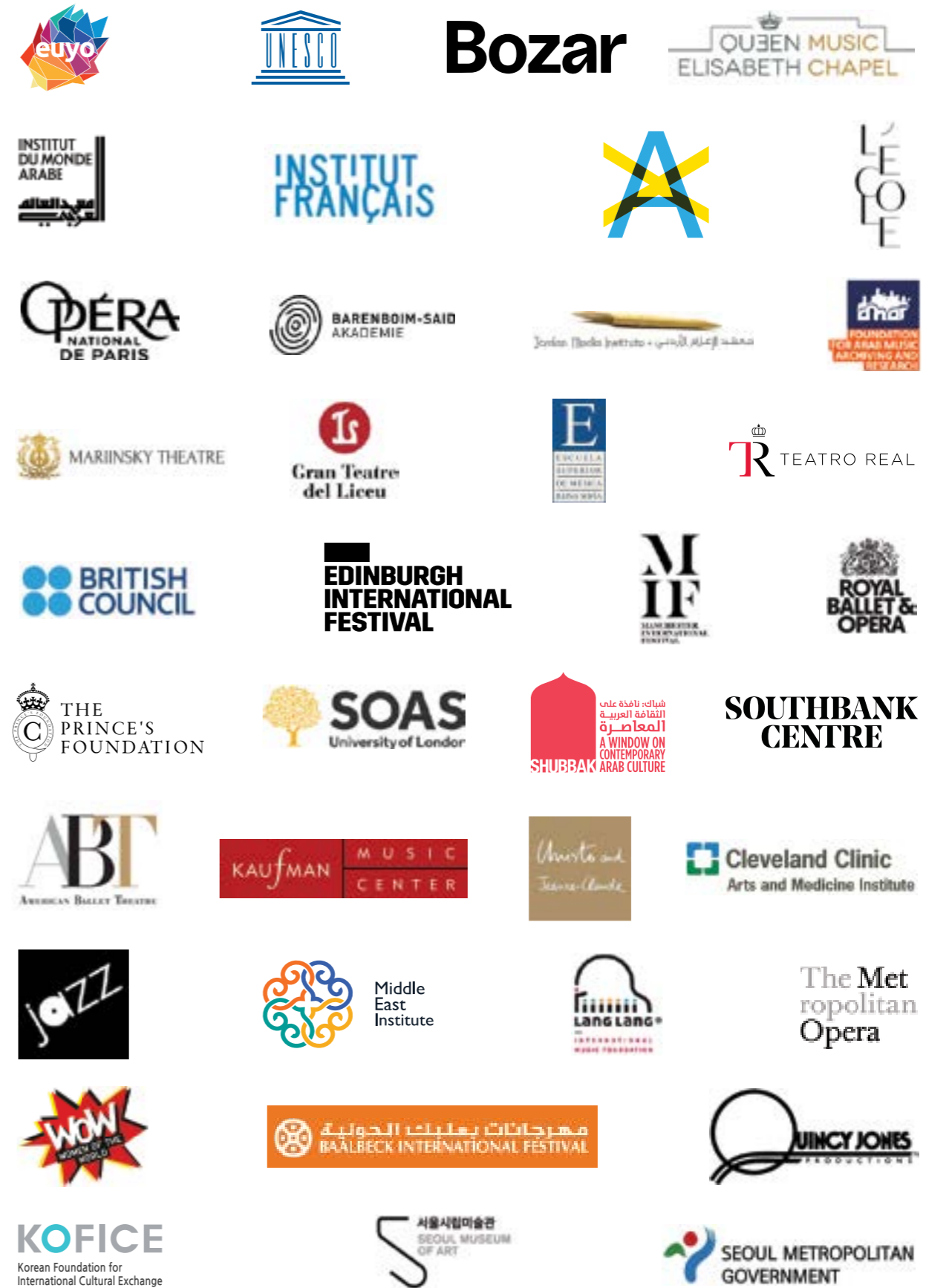

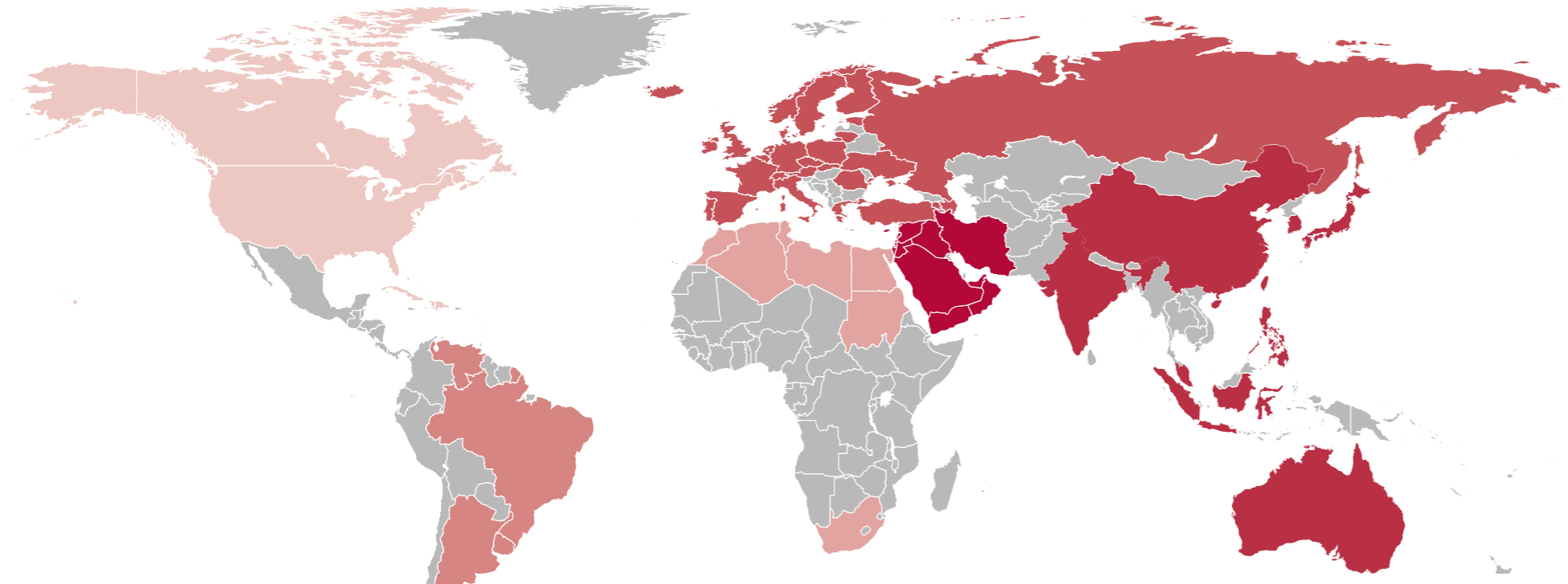

YEAR IN REVIEW



In 2024, ADMAF achieved new milestones, while continuing to showcase its unwavering commitment to nurturing artistic talent and promoting cross-cultural dialogue. The 21st edition of Abu Dhabi Festival celebrated the UAE's enduring 40-year partnership with this year's Country of Honour, the Republic of China, captivating audiences and further reinforcing the UAE's standing as a global beacon of cultural excellence. The Festival welcomed some of the world's most acclaimed artists to the nation's capital, presenting an exceptional programme of performances, co-productions, exhibitions, and Arab World premieres.

This year, ADMAF reaffirmed its commitment to empowering the nation's youth through an array of capacity-building initiatives designed to equip them with the skills and knowledge needed for success. Over the course of the year, aspiring, emerging, and established Emirati talents actively engaged in professional development opportunities, including masterclasses, workshops, mentorships, and training programmes. These unparalleled opportunities empowered the nation's youth to thrive, refine their talents and skills, while pushing the boundaries of their artistic expression.

This year, ADMAF also established new partnerships with regional and international institutions, strengthening its global reach through cultural diplomacy and exchange. In April, the Foundation forged a significant partnership with the Anwar Gargash Diplomatic Academy (AGDA), paving the way for joint initiatives aimed at enhancing the UAE's position as a global leader in culture and creativity. Subsequently, Founder of ADMAF, H.E. Huda Al Khamis-Kanoo, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in cultural collaboration between ADMAF and the Seoul Metropolitan Government with the Mayor of Seoul, H.E. Oh Se-hoon, for the first time in the Arab World at the Emirates Palace in Abu Dhabi. This was followed by an MoU signing with the Korean Foundation for International Cultural Exchange (KOFICE), reaffirming ADMAF's dedication to deepening artistic and cultural ties with Korea. Furthermore, ADMAF's renewal of its MoU with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) strengthened their shared vision for soft power and commitment to enhancing the UAE's global cultural presence, building on the initial agreement signed in March 2018.

Overall, 2024 epitomised ADMAF's continued commitment to nurturing talent and building cultural bridges. The 21st edition of the Festival continued its mission of connecting Abu Dhabi with the world and vice versa, featuring world-class performances, first-of-its-kind collaborations and groundbreaking premieres. 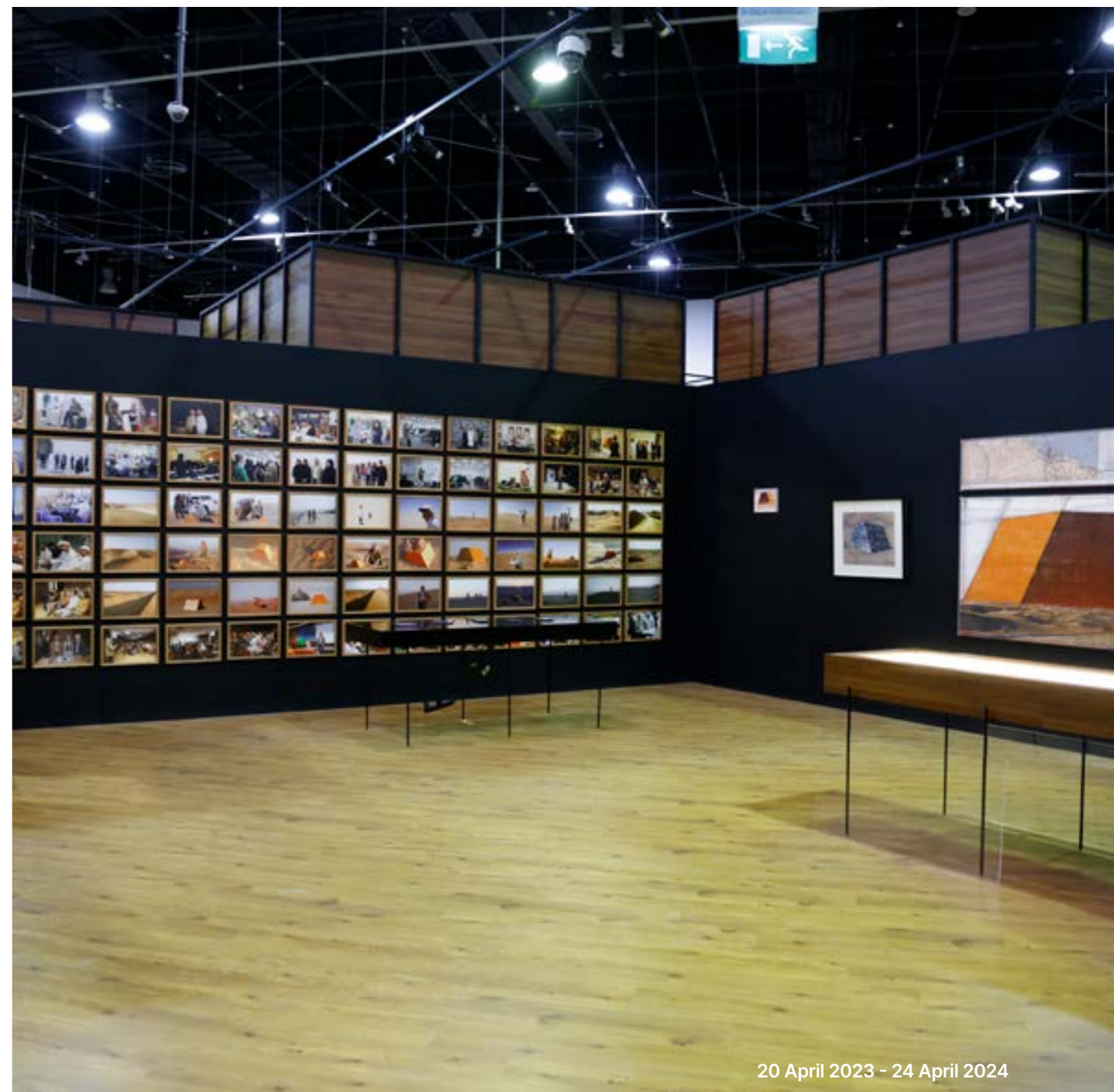

The Foundation had a strong presence at Art Dubai from 28 February to 3 March 2024, engaging with fair visitors and artists. It presented its Abu Dhabi Festival 2024 activities, including publications, exhibitions, awards and other projects.

During Abu Dhabi Art, ADMAF unveiled two works: the specially commissioned art installation, 'Woven by Hands, Walked by Generations,' by Emirati artist Ayesha Hadhir, and The Christo & Jeanne-Claude Award-winning artwork for 2024, 'Datecrete Bee Hotel,' by artists Sara Farha and Khaled Shalkha. Ayesha Hadhir's commissioned artwork was presented as part of the 'Craft as a Language' partners section at Abu Dhabi Art. It was activated by a daily performance, presented in partnership with House of Artisans, Abu Dhabi, featuring Afra Al Mansoori and students from the NYUAD Arts and Humanities Division's Theatre Programme, 'Site Specific Performance Course.' Additionally, students from public schools were invited to Abu Dhabi Art for guided tours with a special focus on the ADMAF commissioned artworks.

ADMAF also presented two insightful panel discussions featuring leading art experts and academics from the UAE and the Republic of Korea. The first panel discussion, titled 'We Are All Open Circuits: 1984-2024 - The Fading Fortunes of Network Utopianism,' presented in partnership with the Korea Foundation for International Cultural Exchange (KOFICE) and the Nam June Paik Art Center, explored the tensions between the utopian vision of global connectivity and the realities of today's interconnected world, inspired by the work of the Father of Video Art, Nam June Paik. Moderated by independent curator and ADMAF advisor, Maya El Khalil, the panel featured notable speakers including Dr. Namhee Park, Director of the Nam June Paik Art Center and artists Byungjun Kwon, Ayoung Kim and Lawrence Abu Hamdan.

In partnership with Abu Dhabi Art, the Foundation presented a panel discussion titled 'Craft as a Language,' featuring artists Ayesha Hadhir, Meherunnisa Asad, and Sara Al Khyyal, and moderated by Chinasa Ezugha, Assistant Arts Professor of Live Art at NYUAD. This insightful panel discussion explored the idea of craft as a form of language - how diverse craft practices, ranging from visual arts and textiles to woodworking, ceramics, and beyond, function as powerful tools for communication and self-expression. Focusing on their work presented at Abu Dhabi Art, the panelists discussed how their craft transcends technical skill to become a rich, nuanced form of storytelling.

As part of the ongoing institutional collaboration with the Seoul Museum of Art (SeMA), ADMAF hosted key partners from SeMA at Abu Dhabi Art for a comprehensive itinerary, including curatorial meetings and studio visits to continue establishing a roadmap for two historic upcoming exhibitions in 2025 in Abu Dhabi and Seoul.

Ayesha Hadhir's artwork, 'Woven by Hands, Walked by Generations,' captures the delicate balance between tradition and innovation, reflecting the UAE's rich cultural heritage. The table, with legs sculpted to resemble the human forms, embodies our responsibility to uphold the weight of ancestral craftsmanship. Resting upon these legs is a 'mandoos,' a traditional chest symbolising the preservation and transmission of crafts across generations. Beneath, AI-generated fishnet patterns interwoven into a carpet evoke the sea's sustenance and the intricate craftsmanship of the past. The Sadu loom spins the threads of cultural identity forward, binding the legacy of the past to the future, it speaks to the next generation, urging them to remember and carry forward the stories, skills, and spirit of those who came before. Each component of the installation narrates the journey of our heritage - how we stand on the shoulders of those who crafted before us, and how, like the loom, we continue to weave tradition into tomorrow.

The artwork installation was activated with daily performance at Abu Dhabi Art, in partnership with House of Artisans and students from NYUAD Arts and Humanities Division's Theatre programme 'Site Specific Performance Course,' further deepening the experience of this cultural exploration.

ADMAF X SeMA HISTORIC PARTNERSHIP

THE NATIONALS' GALLERY

A dedicated resource that advocates for Emirati visual arts practice nationally and internationally, providing access to opportunities, information and support.

ADMAF's Nationals' Gallery - Riwaq Al Fan Al Emirati - is for artists, collectors and art lovers - a network that connects and informs, bringing together people and opportunities. Registration connects members to opportunities and grants access to a comprehensive art resource. Launched in 2010, this permanent initiative comprises a research centre, online directory, education hub, advocacy and an information resource that supports Emirati artists, seeking to raise understanding of the national arts sector among gallerists, curators and the wider public.

EXHIBITIONS & STUDIO VISITS

ADMAF creates exhibitions and publications to deepen the appreciation and knowledge of Emirati visual arts. Supported by ADMAF in 2024, Emirati artist Roudhah Al Mazrouei's work was featured in a group exhibition titled 'Elemental Relations' at the European Cultural Centre's Palazzo Mora in Venice, Italy. The group exhibition, curated by a team of NYUAD faculty, also highlighted work from eight current New York University Abu Dhabi NYUAD students and recent graduates from its Master of Fine Arts (MFA) and Bachelor of Arts (BA) programmes. On the occasion of Abu Dhabi Art, ADMAF hosted important partners from the Seoul Museum of Art (SeMA), organising studio visits with UAE-based artists.



ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION AT MOHAMED BIN ZAYED UNIVERSITY OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (MBZUAI) WITH IRÈNE HEDIGER

As part of a research visit to Abu Dhabi supported by ADMAF, Irène Hediger, Head of the Artists-in-Labs programme at the Zurich University of the Arts, participated in a roundtable discussion organised by ADMAF in partnership with Mohamed bin Zayed University of Artificial Intelligence (MBZUAI).

Held at MBZUAI, the roundtable brought together researchers and professors from the university alongside Emirati visual artists. The significant gathering created a platform for dialogue, encouraging the open exchange of questions, ideas, and perspectives.

LECTURE AT THE SCHOOL FOR CURATORIAL STUDIES IN VENICE

In July, multimedia conceptual artist Moza Almatrooshi, based in Sharjah, UAE, delivered a lecture at the prestigious School for Curatorial Studies in Venice, Italy.

Moza Almatrooshi gained her MFA in Fine Art from the Slade School of Fine Art in London in 2019 and a diploma in culinary arts from ICCA Dubai in 2020. Her practice often examines everyday materials and habits to reveal societal and power dynamics. She creates fictions and metaphors rooted in regional food production and politics, expressed through performance, moving image, audio media, and text.

In 2024, her artwork *The Confectioner & Baker's Alphabets* (2021) - which featured in the ADMAF exhibition *Portrait of a Nation II* (2022) - was the subject of a lecture she delivered to students at the School for Curatorial Studies in Venice. The work explores the gestures of bakers and confectioners in the UAE, imagining their movements as alphabets and sequences with linguistic significance. Almatrooshi reframes the sounds produced by bakery machines and the movements of bakers' fingers into an audioscape that accompanied the piece.

A flexible resource with no permanent gallery, ADMAF welcomes enquiries from institutions interested in loans from the collection. Gifts by individuals and organisations are gratefully received and are assessed based on factors such as condition, provenance, storage and cultural value.

In 2024, ADMAF expands its efforts to promote arts, culture, and diplomacy across the UAE and beyond, driven by the impactful work of its Education and Community department. Through extensive and comprehensive professional training opportunities, ADMAF empowered emerging talent with the skills and expertise needed to thrive in the arts and creative industries. Over the course of the year, engaging educational initiatives ignited creativity in young minds and deepened their appreciation of the UAE's cultural landscape. In close collaboration with regional and international institutions - including a key partnership with the Abu Dhabi Department of Education and Knowledge (ADEK) - ADMAF aligned educational experiences with national curriculum milestones, delivering workshops, cultural visits, and dialogue sessions to enrich students' understanding of the arts. Together with these partnerships, a dynamic calendar of community activities catered to people of all ages and backgrounds, providing meaningful opportunities to engage with the arts and connect with one another.

YOUNG MEDIA LEADERS

IN ASSOCIATION WITH SKY NEWS ARABIA AND SYNDICATION BUREAU

JANUARY - APRIL

Young Media Leaders (YML) is an experience-based, capacity-building, and career development platform for aspiring media professionals. The annual programme enables future journalists to gain the passion, mission, and conviction to become powerful and convincing storytellers. Training sessions and practical skills workshops develop industry-focused portfolios that allow their media careers to take off. Young Media Leaders influences and creates a powerful community of emerging professionals, building a positive and integrated media sector responsive to future challenges, innovations and opportunities.

In 2024, for the 17th edition of the Young Media Leaders programme, ADMAF partnered with Sky News Arabia and the Syndication Bureau to deliver intensive workshops by media experts and distinguished guest speakers. Through this pioneering partnership, students participated in a series of insightful workshops covering various aspects of the media industry. The workshops were led by prominent media professionals, including Rami Majzoub, Head of the Sky News Arabia Academy, along with news presenters Eisa Al Marzooqi, Michella Haddad, and Robert El Nakhl. Leveraging Sky News Arabia's affiliation with the International Media Investments (IMI) group, students also attended a session by Saeed Saeed, a features writer at The National, another respected media outlet within the esteemed IMI group.

As part of the programme, the students also engaged in sessions facilitated by other prominent figures in the media landscape, including H.E Mohammed Al Hammadi, Chairman of the UAE Journalists Association, Tony Baroud, a notable media personality and social media influencer, and Safia Al Shihhi, a recognised media personality and social media influencer. Through these interactions, the trainees were able to gain first-hand insights into the industry, shaping their understanding of the media landscape, and helping them navigate their career paths effectively.

In March, the ambitious students applied the skills they had learned to cover the headline programme of the 21st edition Abu Dhabi Festival. Young Media Leaders compiled and published the ADMAF Tribune, contributing reviews and articles, and produced video interviews with the stars of the Festival.



YOUNG FILMMAKERS' CIRCLE

APRIL - NOVEMBER

A programme designed to provide young filmmakers with a platform to showcase their talents, develop their skills, and connect with industry professionals through workshops, mentorship, and networking opportunities.

In 2024, ADMAF supported young Emirati filmmakers through its partnerships with two leading cultural institutions within the region: the Al Qassimi Foundation and the Sharjah Art Foundation, as part of this important initiative.

ADMAF, in collaboration with the Al Qassimi Foundation, supported the production of short films by Emirati filmmakers, with a focus on documentaries that explore themes relevant to the UAE and the Gulf region. The initiative aimed to increase the production of Emirati short films, support emerging local talent, and promote diverse narratives that reflect the richness of Emirati culture, identity and heritage. Through this partnership, ADMAF and the Al Qassimi Foundation supported the production of the Emirati filmmaker Ahmed Hassan Ahmed's project titled, 'Umbilical Cord.'



The Sharjah Art Foundation, in partnership with ADMAF, held an open call for Emirati filmmakers to support independent Emirati cinema which was awarded to one young filmmaker as jointly selected by both institutions. The scheme is part of the seventh edition of the Sharjah Film Platform (SFP) Short Film Production Grant, designed to support short films - 50 minutes or less - that explore contemporary filmmaking. In 2024, young filmmaker, Hana Kazim, was awarded with the top prize for her short film, 'Yathoom.'



THE ARTISTS' STUDIO

JANUARY - DECEMBER

This online platform of interviews with the stars of the stage and screen aims to inspire and inform young people about the value of creative thinking and artistic expression. Throughout the Festival seasons, members of ADMAF's Young Media Leaders programme, had the unrivalled opportunity to engage with and interview world-renowned musicians from 21st edition of Abu Dhabi Festival's exceptional lineup. Each recorded interview joined past episodes from previous editions on the Festival's YouTube channel. This year's Artists' Studio series featured interviews conducted by Young Media Leaders with members of the National Ballet of China, artists from the Puccini Opera Gala and American composer Kamasi Washington.



YOUNG PHILANTHROPISTS

OCTOBER

ADMAF, in collaboration with the Pearl Initiative, presented the second edition of the Youth Impact Lab as part of its Young Philanthropist Programme, which aims to empower UAE youth to develop innovative solutions to Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) challenges. Youth Impact Lab 2024 brought together ten student teams from leading universities across the UAE, including Anwar Gargash Diplomatic Academy, Middlesex University, the Higher Colleges of Technology (HCT), Skyline University College, Khalifa University, Abu Dhabi School of Management, American University of Sharjah (AUS) and Ajman University.

Members of the winning team, including students from Khalifa University, were awarded with a one-month internship at ADMAF, to nurture their talents and enhance their skills in professional work environment. The programme aligns closely with the Pearl Initiative's commitment to fostering a culture of good governance and sustainability within the region by equipping young leaders with the tools and opportunities to actively participate in the creative economy and meaningful dialogue.

Supporting Charter Schools, ADMAF in collaboration with Shakespeare4Kids presented two special performances of the marvellous musical production, Peter Pan, at Mubarak Bin Mohammed Charter School and Al Qurm Charter School with students from Al Budoor Charter School. Following the premiere, Emirati playwright Reem Al Menhali visited Um Al Emarat Public School on 24 October to deliver a unique theatre workshop giving students the opportunity to learn from her expertise in the world of Emirati theatre.



THEATRE SCRIPT WRITING WORKSHOP

OCTOBER - NOVEMBER

In partnership with the Sharjah Performing Arts Academy (SPAA), ADMAF hosted a six-week scriptwriting workshop series led by professional playwright Rebecca Crookshank, giving students a unique opportunity to dive deep into the world of scriptwriting for theatre.

Students gained an invaluable insight to the essential skills in script development, character creation, and narrative structuring with bilingual support in Arabic and English. Each session built toward the creation of twelve original ten-minute short plays, culminating in a live reading by actors, bringing these stories to life live on stage.

Orchestra of Dream, featuring the Abu Dhabi Youth Orchestra, graced the stage of NYU Abu Dhabi's Blue Hall on 27 November as part of the 2024 Korea Season in the UAE. Marking the Arab World premiere, this exceptional performance celebrated the musical talents of youth from both nations. The concert was organised by the Abu Dhabi Festival in collaboration with the Korea Foundation for International Culture Exchange (KOFICE) and co-presented by the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism of the Republic of Korea. The evening offered a truly magical musical experience, bringing together cultures through the universal language of music and showcasing the extraordinary talent and collaboration of the young musicians from the UAE and Korea.



INTERNSHIPS AND CULTURAL MANAGEMENT

JANUARY - AUGUST

A professional development programme for cultural workers from diverse disciplines. Designed to instil skills and build networks for long-term creative partnerships across the UAE, the programme focuses on gaining practical work experience. In 2024, ADMAF awarded 5 internships to students from Zayed University and Higher Colleges of Technology for a three-month period, giving them the opportunity to work with the Foundation's Visual Arts, Marketing & Communications, Education & Community and Graphic Design teams. In addition, the winning students from Khalifa University of the ADMAF's Young Philanthropist Programme in collaboration with the Pearl Initiative were awarded with a one-month internship at ADMAF.



RIWAQ AL ADAB WAL KITAB

Riwaq Al Adab Wal Kitab aims to strengthen and support the Emirati publishing industry by presenting the achievements of Emirati and Arab writers. The initiative seeks to foster creativity among local writers and to preserve and celebrate the beauty of the Arabic language in literature.



INTERNATIONAL MOTHER LANGUAGE DAY 2024

CULTURAL FOUNDATION

For International Mother Language Day 2024, ADMAF's Riwaq Al Adab Wal Kitab celebrated linguistic and cultural diversity, emphasising the power of multilingualism. In 2024, ADMAF hosted a special panel discussion as part of its Riwaq Al Adab Wal Kitab series at the Cultural Foundation in Abu Dhabi.

The programme featured opening remarks from H.E. Huda Al Khamis-Kanoo, Founder of ADMAF, and H.E. Dr. Ali bin Tamim, Chairman of the Abu Dhabi Arabic Language Centre (ALC).

This was followed by a talk moderated by Ali Al Abdan, Director of the Artistic Heritage Department at the Sharjah Institute for Heritage, with panellists including H.E. JANUARY TO DECEMBER

As part of the Festival in Focus programme - an initiative designed to nurture creativity and inspire young minds through firsthand exposure to the performing arts - students from across Abu Dhabi had the unique opportunity to attend open rehearsals for several world-class performances. These included the National Ballet of China on 25 January at Emirates Palace; the Puccini Opera Gala on 30 January at Emirates Palace Auditorium; Pablo Ferrández on 1 February at The Blue Hall, NYUAD; and Kamasi Washington on 2 February at Emirates Palace Auditorium. Students also observed rehearsals by Pretty Yende & Francesco Demuro on 10 February and Yemen Saadi & Julien Quentin on 13 February, both at NYUAD Red Theatre. The open rehearsal programme - that seeks to foster creativity in young people and inspire exploration of the arts as a means of expression - concluded with a rehearsal of the China National Symphony Orchestra on 14 December..

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MASTERCLASSES

JANUARY TO DECEMBER

As part of the Festival's ongoing commitment to investing in the potential of the nation's youth, a series of specialised masterclasses provided aspiring artists with invaluable opportunities to meet and learn first-hand from internationally acclaimed performers and headline artists. These sessions offered immersive, discipline-specific training across music and dance, forming a vital part of the Festival's education and outreach initiatives.

The programme included a ballet masterclass with Principal Dancer Li Wentao of the National Ballet of China on 27 January, followed by wind and string masterclasses with the Puccini Orchestra Quintets on 30 January. A jazz masterclass with Kamasi Washington took place on 2 February, and a vocal masterclass with tenor Francesco Demuro was held on 10 February. On 14 February, string and piano masterclasses were led by violinist Yemen Saadi and pianist Julien Quentin.

Later in the month, the Festival hosted a vocal masterclass with Lawrence Brownlee and a piano masterclass with Fabio Centanni on 24 February, followed by a piano masterclass with Kirill Gerstein on 26 February.

Also during the season, a contemporary dance masterclass was conducted by the Korea National Contemporary Dance Company on 17 November, followed by violin and cello masterclasses with members of the China National Symphony Orchestra on 13 December - underscoring the Festival's year-round dedication to nurturing the next generation of performing artists.

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BACK TO SCHOOL


JANUARY TO DECEMBER

Back to School is an interactive programme that engages young minds and sparks creativity, offering students the unique opportunity to learn first-hand from the world's leading musicians and artists in an intimate school environment. As part of this year's Festival, ADMAF held a series of interactive mini-performances in schools and universities across the country, with the aim of fostering a passion for the arts and creating new audiences for future performances in the UAE and beyond.

These included a Back to School visit by Leia Zhu to Mohammed bin Zayed University of Artificial Intelligence (MBZUAI) on 7 February, during her music residency and as part of ADMAF's partnership with MBZUAI, followed by an intimate session for vocal students with Pretty Yende at NYU Abu Dhabi on 10 February.

At the American Community School, students enjoyed an intimate recital by the Jussen Brothers on 19 February, and four musicians from the China National Symphony Orchestra (CNSO) visited MBZUAI on 13 December ahead of their Arab World Premiere performance at the Abu Dhabi Festival.



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TALENTS ON STAGE

The Festival proudly welcomed young talents to the stage alongside the National Ballet of China during their Arab World Premiere performance of Chinese New Year - a reimagining of Tchaikovsky's masterpiece, The Nutcracker, on 26 and 27 January 2024.

Thirteen young girls, aged from 5 to 7, performed with the National Ballet of China as part of this vibrant celebration of Chinese culture, co-presented by the Abu Dhabi Festival and the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in the United Arab Emirates, at Emirates Palace.

During the residency, she mentored some of the UAE's most promising young string musicians from music centres, schools, and youth orchestras across the nation. The Young Musicians programme concluded with an inspiring recital, where this exceptional young artist shared the stage with her students - celebrating talent, dedication, and the transformative power of music.

GULF CAPITAL - ADMAF CREATIVITY AWARD

Since its launch in 2013, the Gulf Capital - ADMAF Visual Arts Award has supported and celebrated emerging Emirati artists and visual arts undergraduates from universities across the UAE. The award, which recognises rising stars who demonstrate exceptional creativity in any visual art form, was presented to UAE University graduate Abdulla Alneyadi, a multidisciplinary artist with a passion for heritage-inspired design.

Alneyadi explores themes of memory and identity through material and form. His winning installation, *Eternal Gateways*, was inspired by the old metal gates of UAE neighbourhoods and symbolises community, individuality, and craftsmanship - honouring the nation's cultural roots while evoking nostalgia and unity. This year's award continues ADMAF's mission to nurture the next generation of Emirati creatives, emphasising the importance of innovative artistic expression.



TOTALENERGIES SUSTAINABILITY DESIGN AWARD

Celebrating outstanding innovation and achievement by young Emiratis in sustainable design, the TotalEnergies Sustainability Design Award nurtures creative talent with visionary approaches for the future. Serving as a launch pad for emerging designers and architects across the UAE, the award promotes innovation in the vital field of sustainability. The 2024 award went to two student artists from Zayed University - Tasneem Albaiti and Alreem Alameri - for their winning work titled, 'Graphic Design's Contribution to Environmental Sustainability Through Leaf Waste-Derived Paper in the UAE.' Together, the two talented students aim to raise awareness of sustainability through creative and scientific solutions, demonstrating the power of interdisciplinary collaboration for a greener future. Their project explores the use of ghaf and palm leaves as sustainable alternatives to traditional wood pulp in papermaking, utilising the kraft pulping process.

Supported by ADMAF, the gifted designer embarked on a five-day trip to Paris where she attended courses led by master artisans in jewelry creation at L'ÉCOLE campus in Paris. The winning work, 'Al Dana wa Al Khawasa' (The Pearl and the Diver), pays homage to the UAE's rich heritage, honouring Emirati culture and the artistry of the past through a beautiful blend of tradition and contemporary design with precision. The stunning design features pearls symbolising the nation's pearl diving history, alongside hand-crafted Al Khus patterns inspired by woven palm leaves. A render of her work will be exhibited during the Abu Dhabi Festival 2025.





DOLCE & GABBANA X ADMAF DESIGN AWARD

In 2023, ADMAF partnered with iconic Italian fashion house Dolce&Gabbana to launch an annual award to empower young Emirati designers in fashion and jewellery. Open to UAE Nationals aged 18-30, the initiative bridges tradition and innovation, offering a unique platform in couture and craftsmanship. Submissions were judged by an esteemed jury including Stefano Galli, Senior VIP Relations, Alta Moda, Dolce&Gabbana; Asma Al Fahim, Chairwoman of the Abu Dhabi Businesswomen Council and Founder of Villa 88 magazine; Roberto La lacona, Director of Marangoni Institute UAE; Azza Al Qubaisi, jewellery artist, product designer and sculptor; Ahmad Al Areef Al Dhaheri, multidisciplinary artist; Sultan Al Darmaki, fashion designer; and H.E. Huda Al Khamis-Kanoo, Founder of ADMAF. The Fashion category invited contemporary abaya designs inspired by Emirati culture, with five selected for a Dolce&Gabbana capsule collection. The Jewellery category blended Emirati heritage with Italian craftsmanship through micromosaics, gold, pearls, and other fine materials.

At the 2024 Dolce&Gabbana x ADMAF Design Award Ceremony, Azza Al Tawila was presented with the winning award for her elegant and timeless fashion designs. Her winning submission featured contemporary abaya designs inspired by Emirati culture, with five selected for a Dolce&Gabbana capsule collection.

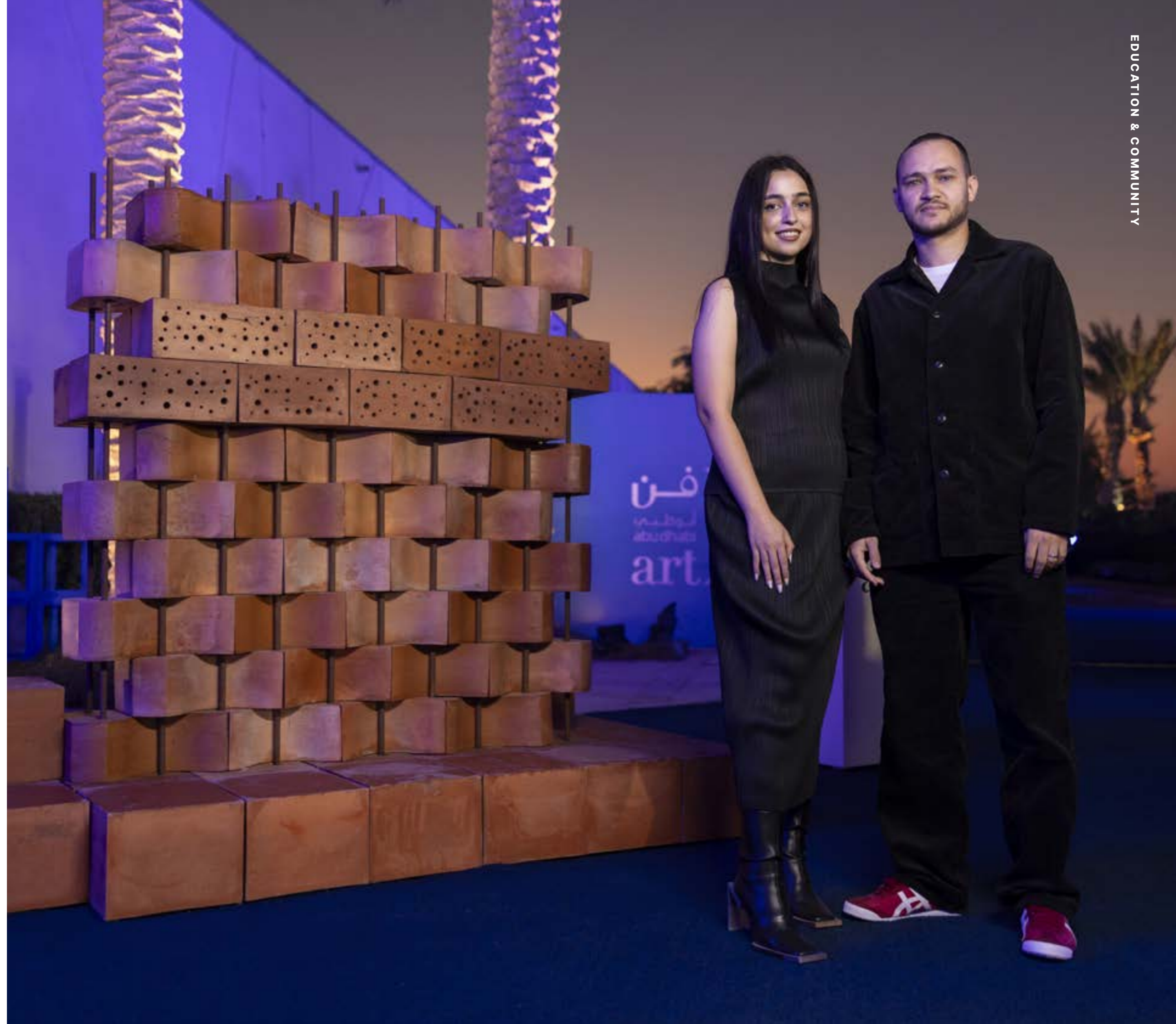

The 12th edition of The Cristo and Jeanne-Claude Award, held in partnership with NYU Abu Dhabi and under the patronage of Her Highness Sheikha Shamsa bint Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Nahyan, was unveiled in a special ceremony at Abu Dhabi Art on 19 November 2024, in the presence of esteemed guests. The winning artwork, Datecrete Bee Hotel, by artists Sara Farha and Khaled Shalkha, merges science with ecological awareness, featuring a new, sustainable material made from date pits, without the use of concrete or resin. Designed to attract solitary bees over a three-month period, the project was documented on film and was on display at Abu Dhabi Art until 24 November, followed by an exhibition at NYUAD from 26 November to 11 December, and concluded with a final presentation at Umm Al Emarat Park from 12 to 27 December.

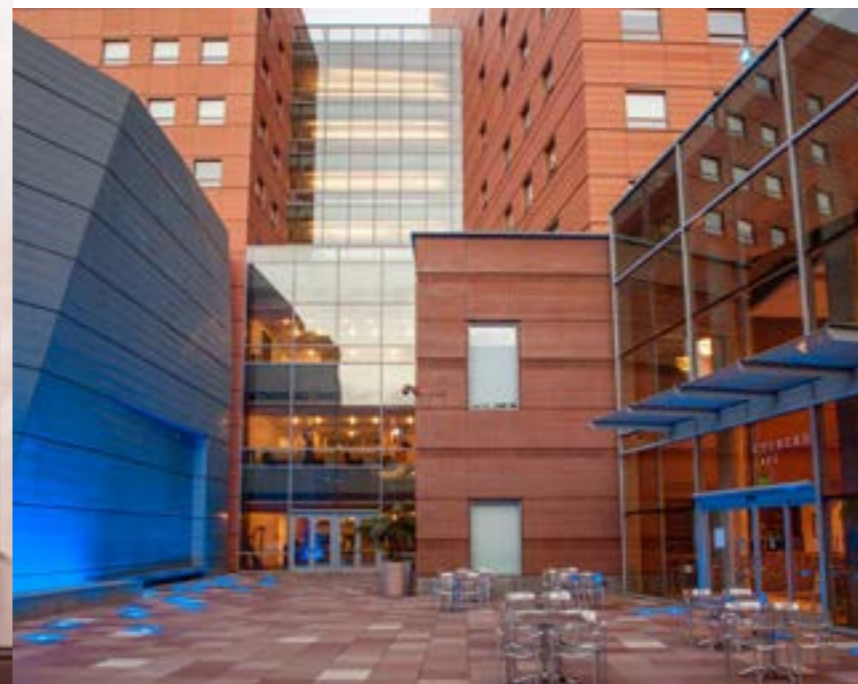
ABU DHABI FESTIVAL HONOURS MAESTRO DANIEL BARENBOIM

Her Excellency also met with a high-level delegation of senior officials from Hong Kong's arts scene, including Mr. Kenneth Fok, Chairman of the Hong Kong Arts Development Council, Dr. Wilfred Wong, Vice-Chairman of the Culture Commission of the Hong Kong Government, and Mr. Nicholas Ho Lik-chi, Commissioner for the Belt & Road Office. The key focus of the meeting was to explore avenues to enhance cultural collaboration between Abu Dhabi and Hong Kong, including co-productions, artist exchanges, and the potential for joint initiatives to foster creative partnerships and cultural dialogue.
